Through Association

- Adopt the Scouting program through the diocesan Catholic committee on Scouting.
- Appoint a liaison with the diocesan or local council Catholic committee on Scouting.

Through Leadership

- Hold orientation meetings for boys and parents.
- Choose unit leaders.
- Serve as religious emblems counselor for a parish or community, assisting Scouts in attaining their Ad Altare Dei emblem.

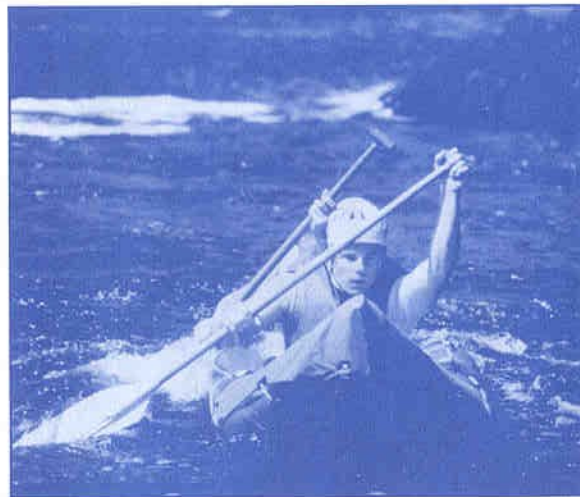
Through Membership

- Recruit boys for the Scouting movement.
- Be an active member of the local or diocesan Catholic committee on Scouting.

How You Can Become Involved

Check Your Council's Participation Potential

- Unit leaders.** Recruit leaders for council-operated units.
- Project help.** Adopt a project that will enrich the quality of local Scouting activities, especially those under Catholic auspices—camporees, Scouting shows, Scout retreats, Scout Sunday observances.
- Financial support.** Catholic committees need operating funds to help make their activities possible. You can assist by underwriting the cost of religious emblems, and by providing the stipend for a priest or seminary chaplain at summer camp.
- Administrative leaders.** A certain amount of study and work is required to make Scouting both an adventure and an asset for young people.
